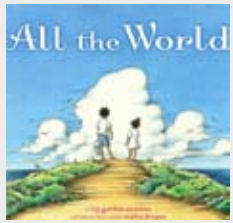

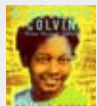

## Coretta Scott King Award

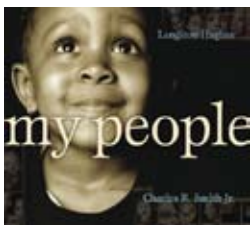
The Coretta Scott King Author Award annually recognizes outstanding books for young adults and children by African American authors and illustrators that reflect the African American experience.

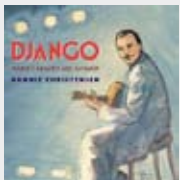

## Pura Belpré Award

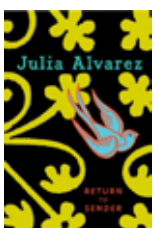

The Sibert Award honors the most distinguished informational book published in English in the preceding year for its significant contribution to children’s literature.

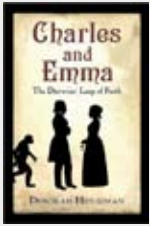
